2. Introduction

These Guidelines set out the funding requirements for Sport Australia's Regional Sport Events Fund. The Australian Sports Commission (ASC), referred to in these Guidelines as 'Sport Australia', is responsible for administering the Fund.

A glossary of key terms used in these Guidelines is attached at [Appendix A](#).

Further information is available at www.sportaus.gov.au/grants_and_funding/regional-sport-events-fund to help you determine if your event is eligible, and to prepare your application. All necessary consultations, planning and approvals should be completed prior to submitting an application for funding under the Fund.

3. About the Regional Sport Events Fund

Sport Australia's Regional Sport Events Fund (the Fund) will invest \$1.9 million to support Local Government (Councils) in regional and remote Australia to host sporting events. Events can range from 'come and try days' to larger events including elite sporting exhibitions and state level competitions that encourage greater visitation to regional Australia, engage communities and reinvigorate local economies.

As regional Australia recovers from the impacts of COVID-19, sporting events will play an increasingly important role in reconnecting and revitalising communities right across the country.

The funding will be available to over 400 eligible Local Government Area (LGA) Councils in Very Remote, Remote, Outer Regional and Inner Regional areas to partner with their local clubs/associations and sporting event organisers to host a wide range of sporting events in their communities.

4. Fund objectives

The objective of the Fund is to support LGA Councils in identified regional and remote locations to host sporting events that will:

- encourage greater visitation to regional and remote Australia
- reinvigorate local economies; and
- provide opportunities for community members to reconnect and celebrate through sport.



5. Funding streams and key dates

The \$1.9 million investment will be available through two funding streams:

5.1 Stream One – Small community sporting events

Stream One is a non-competitive demand driven grant Fund open to Councils in eligible LGAs (refer to Appendix B for a list of eligible LGAs) to support them in hosting community sporting events through grants of up to \$10,000 (GST Excl).

Funding will support the operational requirements and temporary infrastructure needs of the sporting event to boost attendance and/or improve the community experience.

Key dates for Stream One include:

Eligible applicants will be required to satisfy the Assessment criteria requirements as outlined in Section 10.1.

Eligible applications for events under Stream One will be awarded funding up to the requested amount until the total available funding allocation has been exhausted.

5.2 Stream Two – Large regional sporting events

Stream Two is a competitive grant Fund open to Councils in eligible LGAs (refer to Appendix B for a list of eligible LGAs) to support them hosting large sporting events through funding of up to \$50,000 (GST Excl).

The funding will help support the operational requirements and infrastructure needs of large sporting events including hosting events for major sporting codes and elite sport to drive increased tourism in regional and remote Australia and to support local economies.



Key dates for Stream Two include:

Eligible applicants will be required to address the Assessment criteria requirements Section 10.2.

Local Government Councils cannot submit an application in Stream 2 Round 2 if they have submitted an eligible application in Round 1. Only one application for Stream 2 funding will be considered.

5.3 Funding amounts

**Once the total grant funding allocation in Stream One has been exhausted, no further grants will be awarded.*

***The funding allocation for both Round 1 and Round 2 of Stream Two applications is \$900,000.*

6. Eligibility criteria

6.1 Eligible applicants

To be eligible, the primary grant applicant must:

- Be the Local Government (Council) that represents an eligible LGA listed in **Appendix B**



- Not be (and ensure any partner organisation is not) an organisation that is named by the National Redress Scheme for Institutional Child Sexual Abuse on its list of institutions that have not joined or signified their intent to join the Scheme (www.nationalredress.gov.au)
- Have a Child Safe policy (or equivalent)
- The event must include a minimum of one sport which is listed within the ASC Sport Directory. A list of sports can be found [here](#).
- The event must be held within the boundaries of the primary applicants LGA.
- Have no outstanding debts through other funding programs administered by Sport Australia.

6.2 Ineligible applicants

You are ineligible to apply for funding if you are:

- An LGA Council that is not listed in **Appendix B**
- Any organisation or person that is not an LGA Council

6.3 Eligible event timing

Events must be held prior to 31 December 2022.

6.4 Eligible sporting events

Events eligible to receive financial support through the Fund include, but are not limited to:

- Come and try sport days
- Multi-sport festivals
- Sport exhibitions
- Hosting of visiting professional/elite sporting teams
- Regional or State sporting competitions
- Professional sporting code events and elite competitions

6.5 Ineligible event types

Events ineligible to receive financial support through the Fund include, but are not limited to:

- regular community sporting events such as weekly sporting meets (i.e. home/away games, local competitions), club gatherings (RSL, Rotary, Chambers of Commerce etc.)
- agricultural/country shows and field days
- charity funding events
- regional racing carnivals (i.e. horse or greyhound racing) and events occurring as part of a regular schedule of racing
- touring arts events and regular theatre programs
- community public holiday celebrations (i.e. Australia Day or Anzac Day)
- Australian or state/territory government owned and/or operated events
- events held in metropolitan areas of Australia



6.6 Eligible event costs

Eligible event costs include, but are not limited to:

- Installation of temporary infrastructure necessary to ensure an event is accessible, welcoming and inclusive. This includes:
 - Temporary seating
 - Temporary event fencing
 - Temporary ramps and/or accessibility supports
- Temporary, casual staffing directly related to the event
- Entertainment to enhance the community experience
- Promotion and marketing costs
- Risk management planning and COVID safe event planning
- Transport for participating sporting teams to the event within the funded LGA area

6.7 Ineligible event costs and activities

Examples of ineligible event cost, include but are not limited to:

- Purchase of capital assets (e.g. buildings, motor capital vehicles, furniture, with a threshold of up to \$2,000)
- Requests for retrospective funding for events that have already occurred prior to the application open date.
- Domestic travel for participants outside of the applicant LGA
- Appearance fees
- Event bids
- Recurrent operating costs, for example rent and utility costs
- Routine or ongoing maintenance activities
- Events delivered in locations outside of regional and remote Australia.

Note:

- Eligible LGA Councils are invited to submit a maximum of one application per stream.
- Eligible LGA Councils can only submit one eligible application for Stream 2 funding, they cannot submit an eligible application in Round 1 and Round 2.
- Grant amounts awarded will be determined as part of the assessment process under these guidelines and may not be at the level applied for.

7. Partnerships

Eligible LGA Councils will be required to partner with a minimum of one local sporting club, regional sporting association and/or locally based, regional sport event organiser to deliver the event.

The sport/s in the proposed event are identified as sports within the ASC Sports Directory. A list of sports can be found [here](#).



Sport Australia encourages LGA Councils to consider partnering with other local organisations (including those not eligible to be a primary grant applicant) to enhance the delivery of the Project.

Partner organisations may provide a funding contribution or in kind contribution to the event that provides event or competition sponsorship, coordination and event delivery, communication to stakeholders and resourcing.

8. Event location

Sport Australia will be seeking applications from LGA Councils located in eligible regional and remote Australia only. Events must be delivered in the LGA applying for the funding.

All applicants will be required to list the delivery location/s at which event delivery will occur. As part of the application assessment process, Sport Australia may seek further information from applicants regarding the location of the event.

9. Applicant co-contribution

All applicants will be expected to co-contribute to the overall sporting event costs. Co-contribution includes financial and in-kind support.

In Stream Two, the level of additional in kind and/or financial co-contribution to the large sporting event will be prioritised as part of the application assessment process.

10. Assessment criteria

Eligible applications within the nominated funding stream will need to address the following:

10.1 Stream One - Small community sport events

Assessment of applications submitted through Stream One will be based on the following:

- That the proposed event meets the Fund objectives as outlined in section 4.
- That the proposed budget expenditure items are within the eligible expenses as outlined in section 6.
- That the proposed event timing is within the time period outlined in section 6.

Applicant co-contributions will be considered as part of the assessment process.

Applications that satisfy the above requirements will be awarded funding up to the requested amount until the total available funding allocation has been exhausted.

10.2 Stream Two – Large regional sporting events

Assessment of eligible applications submitted through Stream Two will be based on the following:

Assessment Criteria



How the event will:

- Promote high-quality sporting experiences that appeal to the broadest range of local and visiting community members.

This will be demonstrated by:

- Providing an event plan that clearly outlines the event scope, reach, budget, key deliverables and milestones, risk management procedures and timeframe.
- Detailing how your LGA Council will build awareness through media and event campaigns.
- Detailing how your LGA Council will work with partners to accommodate the event.

Applicant co-contributions will be considered as part of the assessment process.

11. How to apply

Before you apply, please read these Guidelines and related materials to make sure you understand all relevant requirements. You can view the relevant information at

LGAs are invited to submit a maximum of one application per stream. All applications must be submitted online.

To apply, you must:

- submit an online application form via www.sportaus.gov.au/grants_and_funding/regional-sport-events-fund
- provide all the information that we need to assess your application's eligibility.

Please ensure your application is complete and accurate. Giving false or misleading information is a serious offence under the *Criminal Code 1995* (Cth). We will investigate false or misleading information and may not consider your application for the grant.

If you find an error in your application after submitting it, you should notify us immediately at

regionalsporteentsfund@ausport.gov.au. Sport Australia does not have to accept any additional information nor requests from you to correct your application after the closing time.

If you have any technical difficulties using the system, either with attaching documents or submitting the application, you must contact Sport Australia immediately at

regionalsporteentsfund@ausport.gov.au

No allowances will be made for technical issues arising in attempting to submit an application, where the issue has not been reported prior to the application closing time. We do not have to accept additional information or requests to change your submission after the closing time.

11.1 Attachments to your application

Where relevant, supporting documentation will be attached to your online application, the total size of attachments must be 25MB or less.

12. Application assessment process

12.1 Stream One - Small community sport events

The Fund assessment panel, comprising Sport Australia representatives will review applications on an ongoing basis until 29 April 2022 or until the funding allocation is exhausted.

All applications will initially be assessed against the eligibility criteria set by Sport Australia. Eligible applications will then be assessed against the Assessment Criteria to ensure the Fund objectives are being achieved. During the assessment process, Sport Australia may require further information about your organisation or application and may seek to source this information from applicants or any number of external sources.

The application assessment period may take up to 7 business days from the time of submission.

The Grant Approver will make the final decision as to grant recipients and funding amounts after considering the recommendations of the application assessors and the availability of grant funds.

12.2 Stream Two – Large regional sporting events

All applications will initially be assessed by Sport Australia against the eligibility criteria.

All eligible applications will proceed to the assessment panel stage. The assessment panel, comprising Sport Australia representatives will assess applications based on how well they meet the Assessment Criteria and how they compare to other applications.

During the assessment process, the assessment panel will consider the geographical spread of recommended events to ensure national coverage of events is achieved

Sport Australia may require further information about your organisation or application and may seek to source this information from applicants or any number of external sources.

The Grant Approver will make the final decision as to grant recipients and funding amounts after considering the recommendations of the assessment panel and the availability of grant funds.

13. Notification

All applicants will be notified in writing of the outcome of their grant application.

The Grant Approver's decision is final in all matters, including the:

- approval of the grant
- grant amount to be awarded, and



- terms and conditions of funding.

There is no review or appeals process after the Grant Approver's final decision.

14. Successful applicants

14.1 Child safety

Sport Australia is committed to Australian sport environments that are safe, supportive and friendly for children and other vulnerable people. The ASC Child Safe Policy outlines our commitment to child safeguarding, and the obligations and responsibilities of our people and stakeholders to protect children. All grant recipients will be bound by the ASC Child Safe Policy.

Sport Australia has adopted the Commonwealth Child Safe Framework, including the National Principles for Child Safe Organisations. All grant recipients/organisations will be expected to adopt and implement the National Principles for Child Safety and ensure that all child related personnel are compliant with legislation relating to the employment or engagement of people working with children and vulnerable people, including Working With Children Checks (however described) and mandatory reporting of child abuse and neglect. Grant recipients must provide evidence to Sport Australia, upon request, of compliance with child safety requirements.

14.2 Funding agreement

Successful applicants will enter into a Funding Agreement with Sport Australia.

Successful applicants will have 30 days, from the date of a written offer, to execute a Funding Agreement with Sport Australia ('execute' means both the applicant and Sport Australia have signed the agreement). The offer may lapse if the Funding Agreement is not executed within this time. In certain circumstances, Sport Australia may extend this period.

Approval of the grant funding is based on the information provided in your application. Any significant changes to those details will be reviewed to consider their potential impact on the approval.

Grant payments will not be made until an executed Funding Agreement is in place, and Sport Australia will not be responsible for any event expenditure until this time.

Funding approval may have specific conditions that have been determined through the assessment process. Any such details will be specified in the Funding Agreement.

The timeline for conduct of the event will be specified in the Funding Agreement. events can only commence after the application open date, and all events must be completed by 31 December 2022.

14.3 Payment and tax obligations

The Funding Agreement will state the:

- maximum funding amount payable to the Grantee, and
- any Co-contributions applicable to the event.



Sport Australia will not exceed the maximum funding amount under any circumstances. Any extra costs incurred will be the responsibility of the Grantee responsible for the event.

Sport Australia will transfer all grant funding electronically in accordance with the payment arrangements set out in the Funding Agreement.

If your organisation is GST-registered, where applicable, you will be paid the approved grant amount plus GST.

Grants are assessable income for taxation purposes, unless exempted by a taxation law. We recommend you seek independent professional advice on your taxation obligations or seek assistance from the Australian Taxation Office. We do not provide advice on tax.

14.4 Fund evaluation

The Grantee will be required to complete an evaluation for the funded event against its objectives and outcomes. The evaluation must include, but is not limited to:

- Visitation and reach of the event
- economic impact of the event to the community
- key learnings.

Sport Australia may use information from applications and event reports for whole of Program evaluation and promotional purposes. Sport Australia may also conduct interviews, or request information about the grant's impact, to evaluate the Fund's effectiveness in achieving its objectives. Sport Australia may contact a Grantee after an event is completed to assist with this evaluation.

14.5 Monitoring and compliance

Grantees are required to submit progress and financial reports in line with the Funding Agreement.

Required details for reports include:

- progress against proposed event details
- progress against agreed event milestones
- contributions of partners and participants directly related to the event
- expenditure of grant funds against deliverables, and
- evaluation of event success.

Milestones and the amount of detail required in reports will be proportionate to the event size, complexity and grant amount.

Sport Australia will monitor event progress by working closely with Grantees, through assessing submitted reports and may also conduct site visits to confirm details as necessary. In some cases, Sport Australia may need to re-examine claims, seek further information or request an independent audit of claims and payments.

If you become aware of a breach of terms and conditions under the Funding Agreement, Sport Australia must be contacted immediately.



14.6 End of event report

End of event report requirements will be outlined in the Funding Agreement. These requirements may include:

- an evaluation of the completed event, including the outcomes achieved
- providing evidence as specified in the Funding Agreement
- detailing total eligible expenditure incurred for the event
- acquittal of Sport Australia grant amount and expenditure against deliverables
- submission within four weeks of completing the event, and
- reporting in a format provided in the Funding Agreement.

14.7 Ad-hoc report

Ad-hoc reports may be required for the event. This may include reports to confirm progress, or to explain any significant delays or difficulties in completing the event.

14.8 Financial and audit report

Grantees may be asked to provide an independently audited financial acquittal report. A financial acquittal report will verify expenditure of the grant in accordance with the Funding Agreement.

14.9 Event variations

We understand that unexpected events may delay an event's progress. In these circumstances, Grantees, or Sport Australia can request a variation to the Funding Agreement. Any request must be made before the end date of the Funding Agreement and should include details of:

- changed event milestones
- extended timeframe for completion, and
- any changed event activities.

There is no guarantee that a request for an event variation will be successful. In considering a request for variation to the Funding Agreement, Sport Australia will consider your request based on the provisions of the Funding Agreement and the likely impact on the event outcomes.

14.10 Event cancellations

If your event is cancelled or postponed as a result of factors outside your control (ie. prolonged inclement weather or COVID-19 restriction changes) you must contact Sport Australia within 5 business days of the decision to discuss next steps for your project.



14.11 Organisation details

You must inform Sport Australia of any key changes to your organisation or its business activities, particularly if they affect the ability to complete the event, carry on business and pay debts due. This includes the following changes:

- name
- addresses
- nominated contact details
- bank account details.

14.12 Events promotion

You must notify Sport Australia of any material promotional activities relating to the event and provide an opportunity for Sport Australia staff and/or Australian Government representatives to attend. These requirements will be outlined in the Funding Agreement.

Sport Australia will provide Grantees with instructions and communications material to be used to promote the event. This may include social media, website etc.

Grantees will also be invited to partner with Sport Australia to share insights, develop social media content and case studies to illustrate Fund outcomes.

15. Conflict of interest

Any conflicts of interest could affect the performance of the Fund. There may be a conflict of interest, or perceived conflict of interest, if Sport Australia staff and/or you or any of your personnel, for example:

- has a professional, commercial or personal relationship with a party who is able to influence the application selection process, such as a Sport Australia officer
- has a relationship with, or interest in, an organisation which is likely to interfere with or restrict the applicants from carrying out the proposed activities fairly and independently or
- has a relationship with, or interest in, an organisation from which they will receive personal gain because the organisation receives a grant under the Fund.

You will be asked to declare, as part of your application, any perceived or existing conflicts of interests or that, to the best of your knowledge, there is no conflict of interest.

If you later identify an actual, apparent, or potential conflict of interest, Sport Australia must be informed in writing immediately.

Conflicts of interest for Sport Australia staff will be handled in accordance with Sport Australia's Conflict of Interest Policy. The assessment panel will also be required to declare any conflict of interest.



16. How Sport Australia will use your information

Sport Australia may share your information with other government agencies for a relevant Australian Government purpose such as:

- to improve the effective administration, monitoring and evaluation of Australian Government programs
- for research, and
- to announce grant recipients.

16.1 Treatment of confidential information

Sport Australia will treat the information provided by applicants as confidential if it meets all of the three conditions below:

- is clearly identified as confidential with an explanation as to why it should be treated as confidential
- the information is commercially sensitive, and
- disclosing the information would cause unreasonable harm to you or someone else.

16.2 When we may disclose confidential information

Sport Australia may disclose confidential information to:

- Sport Australia's Board and our employees and contractors (and to other Commonwealth employees and contractors as required) to help us manage the Fund effectively
- Sport Australia's Board and our employees and contractors (and to other Commonwealth employees and contractors as required) so we can research, assess, monitor and analyse our programs and activities
- the Minister for Sport
- the Auditor-General, Ombudsman or Privacy Commissioner, and
- a House or Committee of the Australian Parliament.

Sport Australia may also disclose confidential information if required or authorised by law, or if someone other than Sport Australia has made the confidential information public.

16.3 Personal information

Sport Australia must treat your personal information according to the Australian Privacy Principles (APPs) and the *Privacy Act 1988*. This includes informing you:

- what personal information Sport Australia collects
- why Sport Australia collects your personal information, and
- who Sport Australia may give your personal information to.

The details of Sport Australia's privacy policy can be found at:

Sport Australia may give personal information collected, to our Board, employees and contractors, and other Commonwealth employees and contractors as required, so we can:

- manage the Fund, and
- research, assess, monitor and analyse our programs and activities.

Sport Australia may also:

- announce the names of successful applicants to the public, and
- publish personal information on Sport Australia's website.

16.4 Reporting

Effective disclosure and reporting of administered grants is essential for public accountability. Sport Australia publishes grant recipients and funding details on its website.

16.5 Freedom of information

All documents in the possession of the Australian Government, including those about this grant opportunity, are subject to the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (FOI Act).

The purpose of the FOI Act is to give members of the public rights of access to information held by the Australian Government and its entities. Under the FOI Act, members of the public can seek access to documents held by the Australian Government. This right of access is limited only by the exceptions and exemptions necessary to protect essential public interests and private and business affairs of persons in respect of whom the information relates.

All FOI requests must be referred to the Sport Australia FOI Officer: foi.officer@ausport.gov.au.

17. Grant acknowledgement

Sport Australia's approval is required prior to public announcements around funding. If you make a public statement about an event funded through the Fund, we require you, at a minimum, to acknowledge the grant by using the following:

'This event received grant funding from the Australian Government through Sport Australia.'

This may also include the use of Australian Government approved signage. These details will be outlined in the Funding Agreement.
